



## Alice Marie Battaglia

Alice Marie Battaglia passed away on July 1, 2022 in the presence of her husband and close friends at her home in Suisun City following a long illness. She was born on November 1, 1942 in Kansas City, Missouri and moved to Benicia, CA. She graduated from Benicia High School in 1960 and earned a BA in History at UC, Davis in 1964. She also earned an AA in Health Information Technology at Chabot College in 1992.
