Helen was a homemaker during these years. She enjoyed working in their large vegetable garden and her flower gardens were the envy of friends and neighbors. Helen was very active in her children's lives. She always volunteered to be a room mother at Green Valley Elementary School. She was a Sunday School teacher at Trinity Lutheran

Church. Helen was very involved in 4-H. She taught many members, including her daughters, the art of food preservation.

Her grandchildren, great-grandchildren, and great-great-grandchildren are carrying on this tradition. Helen was also a member of the Ladies of the Elks. Helen loved camping and traveling. The family has many memories of the camping trips they took as children and the trips to the mid-west to see where their parents were from.

After Oscar's death, Helen spent many summers traveling and camping with her daughters in their RV's. Last August Helen enjoyed her last camping trip with her daughters, her grandchildren, great-grandchildren, and great-great-grandchildren. Helen loved the outdoors and spending time with her family.
