her last job and retirement.

She married C. Anthony Bomar AKA “her only Tony” or “her Tony only” and was a loving dedicated life partner for more than 51 years, with this marriage came Tracy, her heart daughter and born into this marriage were Lane and Christina who are Tracy’s younger brother and sister.
